About Glen Moray:

The Glen Moray Distillery has been producing the finest quality malt whiskey since it was first established over a century ago in 1897. The distillery sits on the banks of the River Lossie in Elgin, Scotland. Elgin, the capital of Speyside – a beautiful region in the north of Scotland, is situated in the Laich of Moray, otherwise known as the ‘granary of Scotland’, a fertile seaboard plain, between the Moray Firth and the Monadhliath and Cairngorm mountains. This region is synonymous throughout the world with superlative malt whiskey.

COLOR & NOSE

TASTING NOTES

Classic

The classic blend is light gold in color. At full strength, the aroma is fragrant and lightly drying with warming malty notes. The first impression is of butterscotch and shortbread with fresh herbal/grassy notes. Lemon curd and meringue are discovered in the background.

With water, malt and spices combine to reveal oatmeal with a hint of freshly ground black pepper. Lemongrass, tea-tree oil and heather aromatics give the whisky a fragrance throughout.

The mouthfeel is lightly spiced with a warming and gently mouth watering effect. Malty toffee sweetness is present throughout with blackcurrants and a fragrant citrus lemongrass tang. On the finish, shortbread, fresh herbal notes (lemongrass) and the sweet spiciness of ginger marmalade.

Aged 12 Years

At full strength, the aroma of this mid-golden scotch malt whiskey is sweet, fruity and floral, exceptionally well-rounded and balanced in flavor, characteristic of this classic Speyside single malt. The first impression is of Highland toffee and candy floss with honeycomb and sweet malt notes. Herbal top notes are discovered with heather and brambles.

With water, honeycomb changes to beeswax and rich fruity notes emerge with blackcurrants, dried apricots and figs. In the background are enticing spices with cloves and ginger marmalade.

A classic Speyside malt, the taste is smooth, warming and rounded with a good firm body. Lots of sweet, soft malty flavors evolve in the centre of the palate, surrounded by toffee and mouth watering fruits (blackcurrants and dried apricots). Boiling sweets reach the roof of the mouth before the emergence of licorice, tea and nut oil. On the finish toffee, blackcurrants and a hint of licorice remain.

Glen Moray 12 year old is a fine example of Speyside single malt whisky that can be enjoyed on its own or with a dash of water – revealing an additional range of tastes for you to discover.

Aged 16 Years

A rich and mature nose with a robust character and deep gold color. It is reminiscent of dried fruit, perhaps figs and raisins, mixed with chocolate and spices (cloves and boiling sweets). There is a hint of leather and linseed oil giving an overall impression of warmth and depth of character.

With water, barley sugar emerges with mint humbugs and a hint of oak smoke. A whiff of peat is now noticeable.

Sweet, full and exceptionally well-rounded, the taste is smooth with a good firm body, meeting the expectations set from the rich, mature nose. The texture is gently oily and mouth-coating with chewy oak tannins. The flavor is initially of toffee, progressing to mint humbugs and barley sugar and followed by a hint of smoke and peat flavors. Medium to long finish with a flavor and texture reminiscent of barley sugar and humbugs.



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
